### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

## EL 0967 - NIMS ICS All-Hazards Logistics Section Chief Course

**Course Description:** Provides local- and state-level emergency responders with a robust understanding of the duties, responsibilities, and capabilities of an effective Logistics Section Chief on an All-Hazards Incident Management Team (AHIMT). These responsibilities include responding to the incident and effectively fulfilling the position responsibilities of a Logistics Section Chief on an AHIMT. Exercises, simulations, discussions, and a final exam enable participants to process and apply their new knowledge.

**Target Group:** The intended audience(s) are local- or State-level emergency responders who may be designated as Logistics Section Chiefs (LSC) on their local or state Incident Management Team.

Course Prerequisites: IS-0100 An Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS 100, IS-0200 Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response, ICS 200, E/L/G 0300 Intermediate Incident Command System for Expanding Incidents, ICS 300, E/L/G 0400 Advanced Incident Command System for Complex Incidents, ICS 400, IS-0700 An Introduction to the National Incident Management System, IS-0800 National Response Framework (NRF).

## S-430 EL 0958 - NIMS ICS All-Hazards Operations Section Chief Course (Blended)

**Course Description:** Designed for the operations section chief in the incident command system, this interactive course involves exercises designed to facilitate group and classroom discussion to explain the four elements of planning critical to the OSC: information gathering, strategy meetings, preparation of the Incident Action Plan (ICS 215), and the OSC role in demobilization.

**Target Group:** The intended audience(s) are local- or State-level emergency responders who may be designated as Operations Section Chiefs (OSC) on their local or state Incident Management Team.

**Course Prerequisites:** IS-0100 An Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS 100, IS-0200 Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response, ICS 200, E/L/G 0300 Intermediate Incident Command System for Expanding Incidents, ICS 300, E/L/G 0400 Advanced Incident Command System for Complex Incidents, ICS 400, IS-0700 An Introduction to the National Incident Management System, IS-0800 National Response Framework (NRF).

# S-440 EL 0962 - NIMS ICS All-Hazards Planning Section Chief Course (Blended)

Course Description: The course is designed to meet a portion of the training needs of the planning section chief in the incident command system. Topics include information gathering, strategies, meetings and briefings, incident action plan (IAP), interactions, forms, documents, supplies, demobilization, and an optional technology section. In the final exercise, students observe a simulated planning meeting and use the information derived to find errors in an IAP. Students must pass the unit tests and the final exercise to successfully complete the course.

**Target Group:** The intended audience(s) are local- or State-level emergency responders who may be designated as Planning Section Chiefs (PSC) on their local or state Incident Management Team.
