#### **Incident Summary**

At 07:26 on October 21, 2024, the Region 3 Coordinator was alerted via the Hartford County Fire Coordinator internal chat of a large brush fire in Berlin – which became known as the Hawthorne fire. The Hawthorne fire actively burned for weeks, consuming 127 acres. Due to extremely dry conditions, multiple red flag warning days, and abnormally warm weather, dozens more fires ignited throughout the state. As of 11/14, 181 fires have been reported ranging in size. As fire numbers peaked, the SEOC was partially activated to support response efforts. Since then, the SEOC has scaled back from Partial Activation to virtual Enhanced Monitoring. The SEOC is maintaining current posture of virtual Enhanced

Monitoring. Rain is expected throughout the day tomorrow, 11/21 with 0.75 – 1.25 inches of rain.

# **Major Fire Report**

#### Hawthorne Fire

Progress is being made at the Hawthorne Fire with resources from DEEP, Quebec, Green Mountain, and California. CA Groveland Hotshot team returned to assist with fire response on 11/4. On site teams will be patrolling hot spots while monitoring high winds. The current size of the fire is 127 acres. Crews continue to hold the line, U.S. Forest Service IC on scene at staging area. Fire status has been updated to mop up and patrol. There was a stakeholder/residents meeting 11/7, FDNY liaison in attendance. Waiting for FEMA determination on the end of the incident period for the Hawthrone fire. Fire is 95% contained. Email submitted to FEMA R1 agreeing with recommendation for end of incident period to be Sunday 11/10. DEMHS received official notification today, 11/20 from FEMA confirming the end of the incident period today as 11/10.

- **ACTIVE:** Dedicated resources are on scene
- MOP UP & PATROL: Searching for and extinguishing any remaining hot spots in a burned area
- MONITORING: No hotspots or smoke detected. Periodic patrols conducted until rain or snow eliminates heat sources
- INACTIVE: Fires that have been in Monitoring phase for more than 10 days





# **State Response Actions**

# **Incident Action Plan**

- Daily internal state coordination calls will scale back to once daily on weekdays only, at 15:30
- Once daily situation reports will be sent in the evening (weekdays only), after 1530 call

- Maintain State Staging area and Incident Command Post at DOT Campus in Newington
- DEEP continues to leverage Northeastern Forest Fire Protection Compact (NFFPC) as primary method to request mutual aid resources to support incidents.
- DEMHS will continue to monitor unmet needs requests for potential EMAC or IEMG mutual aid requests if NFFPC is unable to fill.
- DEMHS staff continue to collaborate with DEEP to accurately track and plot GIS fire data/information.
- Primary communication will be Microsoft Teams Chat and Fire Coordination Group through Everbridge; convene group on meeting if needed.
- Large fire in Great Barrington, MA has led to strong smoke smell, leading to dispatch centers receiving calls of concern. DEEP/DEMHS posted on socials for awareness.
- DEMHS/DEEP issued a memo to Fire Department Chief re: expenses incurred due to the ongoing statewide fire response
- As the incident period for the Hawthorne Fire has officially ended, DEMHS/DEEP will continue to discuss and collaborate on the FMAG required documentation.
